#### **Race Condition Clarification**

In any Ratings/Optional Claiming race, a horse may be entered for the claiming price and if such horse is not rated, he/she will be assigned highweight of 158 lbs. regardless of age or sex.

#### **Grand National Condition Book Correction**

Post time for the first race at the Grand National will be 2:30 PM.

#### **Radnor Condition Book Change**

The condition of the Allowance Hurdle (#72) should read as follows: For Four Year Olds and Upward which have never won a race other than maiden, claiming, ratings 115 or restricted three-year-old.

#### **Continuing Education for NSA Trainers**

**Purse \$25,000.** Hurdle. For Maidens, Four Years Old and Upward. Four-year-olds, 146 lbs.; older, 154 lbs. Entry fee \$250; \$250 additional if not scratched on time Wednesday; \$250 additional to start; with \$100 additional to be paid to the Old Dominion Hounds Point to Point.

Two Miles over National Fences.

#### Official Notes:

- Permission for apprentice riders to ride in jump races at Colonial Downs, Saratoga, and Aqueduct will be granted by the Stewards Advisory Committee on a case by case, and race by race basis.
- In all steeplechase races at Colonial Downs, Saratoga, and Aqueduct, the first fence in the stretch
  will <u>not</u> be jumped on the final circuit; therefore, the last fence down the backside at all venues will
  be the final fence.
- In all stakes races at Colonial Downs, Saratoga and Aqueduct, Lasix is prohibited. Also, horses 10 years old and upward are <u>not</u> permitted to run at NYRA racetracks.
- Maiden claiming winners are eligible for Saratoga allowance races providing they have won for \$20,000 or greater.
- Maidens over jumps are ineligible for steeplechase races at Saratoga.
- Post times for the Colonial Downs jump races will be 1:30 PM (first) and 2:30 PM (third) each Friday during the meet. The Colonial jump races are now part of the regular parimutuel racing program and as such will follow all of the standard racetrack protocols.
- Limit of field in the maiden hurdle races at Colonial Downs is 10, with 12 allowed in ratings races and the filly/mare stakes.
- All horses entering the Colonial Downs racetrack grounds must have proof of health certificate and required vaccinations, and a current negative Coggins test.



#### Charles Wayne (Skip) Achuff Jr. - Annual Memorial Stalwart of Steeplechase Award

• \$1000 award given to a jockey, race official, race meet director, or others who support the growth of Steeplechase.

#### Qualifications of the award recipient:

- Represents the sport with professionalism, integrity, and dedication
- Knows and upholds the rules of the sport
- Prioritizes safety of the horses, jockeys, and others

Potential recipients are nominated by their peers for performance in 2022 (previous year). Petitioners for nominees must complete an application and submit to the NSA by 28 February. The Achuff family will select from the nominees in March. The winner will be announced and awarded during the 2023 Steeplechase Season.

#### Brief background on Skip Achuff's career with National Steeplechase Association

Skip Achuff grew up in Glen Riddle, Pennsylvania and was a teenager when he first worked as an exercise rider. He became a regular jockey on the National Steeplechase Association circuit in the 1970s and 1980s. He rode his first race May 23, 1970, at Fair Hill in Maryland, finishing seventh aboard Tip Tank for Woodcrest Stable. Achuff had many wins while teaming primarily with legendary trainer Morris "Pop" Dixon. His first official win came May 8, 1971, at Radnor Hunt Spring Race Meeting in Pennsylvania aboard Waterloo Place; a race meet where Achuff would ultimately take the reins as Race Director for almost 2 decades.

Achuff rode many races in the 1970s and into the 1980s and put together a five-win season in 1984. The highlight was a flat win aboard future member of Thoroughbred Racing's Hall of Fame, Flatterer, at Tanglewood in North Carolina. Achuff retired as a jockey then but returned for one more ride in an amateur race finishing fourth at Atlanta in 1986.

After retirement from race riding, Achuff stayed connected and devoted to Steeplechase by serving as an official, a chart caller, and a mentor to young jockeys. In 2005, he became the Race Director for Radnor Hunt Races. He served in that position until his passing, expanding the participation of horsemen and spectators. He was committed to growing the sport and was always quick to encourage and recognize others who did the same.

Skip Achuff passed away on August 28, 2022. He had many talents but was first and foremost a horseman. The Achuff family has created the *Stalwart of Steeplechase* award to honor Skip Achuff's contributions to the sport of steeplechase racing.
