Nominations

Tryon Stewards' Ruling

Jockey Tom Garner (TEASE AND SEIZE) was fined \$350 for careless riding in Race 4.

Maryland Hunt Cup Course Report

The Maryland Hunt Cup racecouse was inspected on Wednesday, April 12 and Sunday, April 16 by Liz McKnight and Nancy Roberts.

Turf: The race is run over fair hunting country. The turf is excellent throughout.

Smoothness: The entire course has been aerated and Cambridge-rolled.

Compaction: 90 (soft); readings ranged from 80-110 (soft-good).

Moisture: 9 (wet); readings ranged from 8-10 (average wet-wet).

Notes: The entire course was aerated the week of April 1, mowed April 9-11 and Cambridge-rolled April 15-17 by Bruce Fenwick. A second aeration will be completed, if needed, later this week. The course will be mowed once or twice more to leave a height of 7 inches on race day. Rainstorms on April 16 improved moisture. A bucket of flags will be available during race week at the first road crossing for course walkers to mark any issues.

Please note the maiden claiming hurdle (#53) condition now reads as follows: **Purse \$25,000. Hurdle. For Maidens, Four Years Old and Upward.** Four-year-olds, 148 lbs.; older, 156 lbs. **Claiming price \$30,000.** For each \$2,500 to **\$25,000**, allowed 3 lbs.

All hurdle races at Willowdale will be run over natural brush hurdles.

150-Day Layoff Report Forms

150-Day Layoff Report Forms can be submitted directly to Dr. Reynolds Cowles online at the following link: http://tharacing.com/resources/layoffreportform/

Entries for horses that have not raced for 150 days or more (excluding first-time starters) will not be accepted unless the trainer has completed and submitted a Layoff Report Form.

Claiming Restrictions

Horses claimed at a racetrack will be subject to the "in-jail" claiming restrictions of that individual racing jurisdiction. However, a horse may run in an NSA "training flat race," which is listed as a workout on the horse's past performances, inside of that time-frame.

New Rider Fees

In the absence of a specified contract, the fee to a rider in a steeplechase race shall be as follows: \$200, or 10% of the money earned in all places (whichever is greater). The fee to a rider in a training flat race shall be \$100. In flat races with purses, the fee to a rider shall be as follows: \$100, or 10% of the money earned in all places (whichever is greater).

Course Inspection Report 2023

Date of Inspection: April 17, 2023 Date of Race Meeting: April 29, 2023 Course : Foxfield Races Race Meet Directors: Dr. R. Reynolds Cowles & Jack Sanford, Jr. Time in : 8am Time out : 9am

Turf: Thick turf-type fescue, smooth uniform. 7" high. Will be maintained at that height until race day. Damage from last fall's races was well repaired in the fall with additional top soil and rolling. The course has been aerated multiple times through the winter and three times in the last five weeks.

Smoothness: Uniform with several weedy patches on the backside of the hurdle course.

Compaction: 130. Our area has been quite dry and we have forecast rain for two days between now and race day.



Moisture: 2 - dry

Turf: Dense, Thick, Lush:

The racecourse is consist primarily of turf-type tall fescue, along with a mixture of hybrid KY Blue Grass and perennial rye. It presents as thick, and lush with no clumping under foot. Fall seeding and aeration produced good germination of seed and is generally free of weed except as noted. The <u>inside</u> rail between Turn 3 and Turn 4 contains a little winter weed (chickweed and clover), has been spot treated where necessary. Also noted; the inside-middle of Turn 3, there is one small area of scattered bare ground that should be of little concern as the hurdles and beacons will be placed on or near the middle of the course. Over two tons of granular slow-release urea was applied October 28, 2022 and again January 28, 2023, which has subsequently improved spring green-up. As mentioned in Report #2, slow-release UREA along with 4% iron sulphate was applied Tuesday, April 4th at a rate of 200# per acre. Warming temps and continued rain fall and/or irrigation over the next two weeks, will further enhance the turf's color, density and top growth.

Smoothness: Smooth:

The racecourse was Cambridge rolled mid-March. The course was Cambridge rolled (again) April 4. The course is <u>very</u> smooth throughout and under foot.

Compaction: Avg. 75-85 (high side of SOFT to low-side of GOOD):

The course has received plentiful amounts of rainfall over the winter and during the early spring. We received 2 ½ inches of consistent but mostly gentle rain over a two-day period last weekend, April 7 & 8. The racecourse <u>was</u> aerated using an Aerway last Thursday, April 6. The course received one half inch of rain Friday, April 14.

Moisture: 10 on a scale of 1-10 (WET):

The racecourse has enjoyed generous amounts of rainfall, (19.24 inches) since January 1, 2023. More rain is expected this afternoon with drying conditions expected throughout the coming weekdays with temps in the mid to upper 70's. Irrigation will be used sparingly depending on the this coming week's rain forecast in order to allow vertical percolation and general tightening of the racecourse in hopes of achieving 'GOING" that is on the high-side of "GOOD" come race day, April 29th.

Additional Comments:

- Soil samples were taken July 2022 on and around the racecourse and grounds. From those soil samples, an aggressive course of treatment was taken to get the soils make-up back in balance.
- Due to continued cold temperatures throughout February and cool temperatures in March, along with measurable amounts of rainfall both months, the racecourse turf and "going" continues to be in perfect shape. NOTE: Racecourse pictures taken April 1, April 6 & April 15.





Other Notes:

- A 1¼ mile NSA Training Flat has been carded this year with allowances for 3 year-olds, Maidens and Apprentice riders. To encourage
 participation, the Queen's Cup Race Committee is offering a \$250 "starter's appearance fee" for ALL runners, with \$1,000 to the
 winning Owner and \$750 to the winning trainer! NEW! All training flat starters will be reimbursed the \$100 NSA entry fee.
- The SafTfence "Modified National Fence" hurdles will be set near or in the <u>middle</u> of the racecourse, similar to 2022.
- As in 2022 "water hurdle", at the base of Member's Hill, will be in play for ALL four hurdle races.
- Rather than the usual two flights on the finishing stretch, there will be one flight placed mid-stretch with an approx. 750' run to the finish-line.
- The Club House Turn was once again, heavily aerated and top dressed immediately after last year's race with 20+ tons of course sand applied.
- To facilitate timely post times, saddling will be in the stable area only. All runners, once saddled, will be organized in the stabling area by saddle cloth number 15 minutes prior to each Post Time and then paraded single-file to the Parade Ring.
- Start positions were re-measured this past week, taking into account the middle racecourse fences placement. All starts were accurate from prior years with the exception of the maiden claimer, which was moved back 100 yards to accommodate a true 2-mile race.

JOCKEYS, TAKE NOTE!

Thanks to a generous donation from **SafTfence | EasyFix** and **Bill & Carrington Price**, two outdoor shower stalls, with **hot** and **cold** running water, were built last year, placed down in the stable area, for the primary use of the participating jockeys. *Please bring your own towels!*



Horsemen Policies (revised)



1. ARRIVING PRIOR TO RACE DAY?: You may pick-up your credentials at the Queen's Cup office on-site prior to 2:00 pm Friday. Please call ahead and let us know. Bill Price: (704) 621-3001 or the Office at: (704) 843-7070.

2. RACE DAY ARRIVAL:

- ✤ BE PREPARED FOR HEAVY RACE DAY TRAFFIC DELAYS
 - HORSEMEN
 - ENTER THROUGH GATE 3: (Intersection of 3830 S. Potter & Crow Roads).
 - Must display 2023 NSA hang tag or SOTA Digital Gate Pass and NSA OTR Pin to gain entry.
 - With the above credentials, you will be directed to the OTR Parking area near Stabling behind Member's Hill

HORSEMEN'S QUEEN'S CUP CREDENTIALS:

- QUEEN'S CUP CREDENTIALS must be obtained at the Horsemen's Check-in tent behind Member's Hill .
- ACCESS TO MEMBER'S HILL & STABLE AREA: Queen's Cup issued Horsemen's Badges are required to gain access to Member's Hill, Stabling and the Racecourse & Parade Ring. This Badge does not gain entry to the "Elkridge Club" hospitality tent on Member's Hill.
- NON-PARTICIPATING HORSEMEN: Each licensed NSA HORSEMEN with 2023 "Horseman" NSA pins, will be given one (1) complimentary ticket onto Member's Hill but does not allow entry into the "Elkridge Club" hospitality tent.
- ARRIVING RACE DAY AFTER 1:00 PM? Please proceed to the front entrance of the Elkridge Club to receive your credentials.
- FINALLY: Please remember to bring your NSA credentials (hang tag and lapel pins) when you pack for the Queen's Cup. •

3. MEMBER'S HILL & ELKRIDGE CLUB CREDENTIALS:

- ✤ RACE DAY PARTICIPATING OWNERS & TRAINERS:
 - Regardless of the make-up of NSA ownership (syndicate, stable name, etc.), Owners receive a total of two (2) • Queen's Cup Horsemen's Badges and a total of two (2) complimentary Elkridge Club tickets. Same for Trainers.
 - Additional Elkridge Club tickets may be purchased in advance or on race day, (see pricing below).

RACE DAY PARTICIPATING JOCKEYS:

- Jockeys receive one (1) complimentary Queen's Cup Horsemen's Badge with one (1) Elkridge Club ticket.
- Jockeys may request one (1) additional Badge, which includes Elkridge Club ticket, at no additional charge.
- Additional Elkridge Club tickets may be purchased in advance or on race day, (see pricing below).
- ✤ NON-PARTICIPATING (RACE DAY) 2023 LICENSED NSA OWNERS, TRAINERS & JOCKEYS:
 - Licensed 2023 NSA Horsemen wishing to gain access to the Elkridge Club tent, may purchase Elkridge Club tickets at the HORSEMEN'S CHECK-IN tent. (see pricing below)

4. PRICING FOR LICENSED NSA HORSEMEN - EXTRA BADGES

- PARTICIPATING NSA Horsemen badge and Elkridge Club ticket, after allotted number \$175 per Adult/ \$85 under 21 (per person)
- NON-PARTICIPATING NSA Horsemen badge and Elkridge Club ticket \$250 for Adult/\$150 under 21 (per person)

5. ACCESSING THE ELKRIDGE CLUB:

- OTRs MUST enter through the <u>front</u> entrance of the Eldridge Club at all times!
- Elkridge Club tickets will be exchanged for a wristband. No meal ticket, no entry.
- Elkridge Club tickets may be purchased at the Horsemen's check-in or in advance of race day.
- The rear entrance is only for exiting.

6. GROOMS MEALS:

- Grooms will be served a light breakfast and box lunch back in the stable area, along with water and soft drinks.
- Grooms should get their HORSEMEN'S BADGE from the Horsemen's Check-in tent. Please wear to gain entry into both the Stable area and the Racecourse

7. SADDLING PROCEDURE:

- At the request from SOTA and the NSA Safety Committee, Horsemen must saddle back in the barn area and parade to the Parage Ring together, in sequential, saddle towel order.
- The Race Meet Committee has asked all horsemen to please be prompt and timely to the Parade Ring. We run on a tight schedule!
