# **OFFICIAL ACTIONS:**

#### PRERACE:

On Friday afternoon the Stewards were informed by the Steward's Advisory Committee that the Safety Steward, with help from Steward Anne Pezzano, would be requested to conduct a search of all tack boxes and equipment of the trainers. This action was initiated as the trainers arrived on Association Grounds (those that had arrived prior to 1:00PM Friday March 22 were searched Saturday morning). The search was completed with no issues or complaints.

Several flagged beacons on the back side were removed from the course during the course set up as they were deemed unnecessary, and a potential hazard should a fence need to be closed. This was done as a result of an incident in the fall. The changes were met with 100% approval from the officials and the riders.

The Jockey's meeting went as scheduled at 11:45. All Jockeys were present and accounted for. The course modifications were explained, and the Course Doctor and Quick Official were introduced. Gerard Galligan was late due to abnormal traffic and was excused.

The officials meeting went as scheduled at 12:00 noon. All officials were present and accounted for. Cook Edens reviewed policies and procedures for closing a fence during the running of a race.

Pre-Race TC02 tests were performed on #4 WEST NEWTON and #5 CARAMELISED. NSA officials had requested testing the entire field, however there was a shortage of test kits.

Post Race tests were performed on the winners of Races 2, 3, 4, 5, and first and second in Race#6.

#2 KENILWORTH KING ran in Pink NSA Silks

#2 KENILWORTH KING and #4 MADE THE CUT pulled up before the last (10th) fence. Both riders

reported their mounts had tired

#7 MR. JEFFERSON lost rider at the first fence; rider Sarah Cundith was cleared

#2 THE INSIDER pulled up after the 8th fence. The rider reported his mount had tired
