Turf: The turf is thick and lush measuring between 4 and 6 inches. Two applications of fertilizer and one of weedkiller have really improved the grass as well as frequent mowing.

Smoothness: The course was cultipacked and aerovated after racing last fall and aerovated in the spring. This has made the course much smoother.

Compaction: 9

Moisture: 8

Notes: The course was gone over with a cultipacker and aerovator last fall after the Races. In the spring we applied fertilizer and weed killer. Fertilizer was applied again in September. Bare spots were fitted and patched last spring and came in nicely. The course was mowed 6 times over the summer and fall. We will aerovate as needed before the races. 9/10ths of an inch or rain was recorded on the course Sunday night and another 3/10th Wednesday night.

Fences: Drop down rails have been redone with new rolled rails that are of a consistent size. New cups have also been added with new PVC pipe. No coops have been removed.

Far Hills Licensing

All Owners, Trainers, Assistant Trainers, Jockeys and Grooms participating in the Far Hills Race Meeting are required to be licensed and fingerprinted by the New Jersey Racing Commission (NJRC). The easiest way to obtain a license is by going to the Commission's website at NJRC HOME and click on "Licensing Forms" on the left-hand side. Grooms will no longer have reciprocity with other racing jurisdictions. A licensing tent will be available in the stable area on race day.

Far Hills Lasix

Lasix is permitted in all races excluding the flat race. Any horse running for the first time on lasix must have a letter from their attending veterinarian recommending the use of the medication.
